Many of us have watched as the white tow truck zooms by our house with a car in tow. Sometimes they stop at the pools and parking lots and check the cars for green Starlight Ranch stickers. No sticker, zip, they're gone. Hopefully, our paths don't cross too often. Tow truck drivers are the fastest growing consumer complaint in America.

I recently read an article from a former tow truck driver and got the dirt on how the business works. There's not a lot of new info here, but it may be useful to know that just because you see some un-towed cars in a towing zone, it doesn't mean it's safe — usually, tow truck drivers leave some cars alone to entice fresh vehicles: "It's kind of like fishing, you want to keep some bait out there."

The driver asked CNN to keep his name anonymous in return he introduced them to the world of repossession and impound towing.

Dan not only worked in repossessions, but also impounded vehicles for private companies. Sometimes he'd patrol apartment complexes and businesses that had hired Dan's company to tow away illegally parked vehicles.

He told us many people ignore the "No Parking" and "24 Hour Towing" signs, and they pay the price. "It might be parked there all night; it might be parked there for 30 seconds; it's just parked there at the wrong time if the tow truck gets it."

So, the next time you see the little white truck and the predator behind the wheel, don't give him the bird. He isn't going away.

4 Best Exercises for Older Adults

For older adults and seniors who want to stay healthy and independent, the <u>National Institutes of Health</u> recommend four types of exercises:

<u>Strength exercises</u> build older adult muscles and increase your metabolism, which helps to keep your weight and blood sugar in check.

<u>Balance exercises</u> build <u>leg muscles</u>, and this helps to prevent falls. According to the NIH, U.S. hospitals have 300,000 admissions for broken hips each year, many of them seniors, and falling is often the cause of those fractures.

If you are an older adult, balance exercises will help you avoid problems as you get older.

And if you are a senior, <u>balance exercises</u> can help you stay independent.

<u>Stretching exercises</u> can give you more <u>freedom of movement</u>, which will allow you to be more active during your <u>senior years</u>. <u>Stretching exercises</u> alone will not improve your endurance or strength.

<u>Endurance exercises</u> are any activity—walking, jogging, swimming, biking, even raking leaves—that increases your heart rate and breathing for an extended period of time. Build up your endurance gradually, starting with as little as 5 minutes of endurance activities at a time.

Starlight Ranch provides a fitness center for residents at the back clubhouse.

IRS Warns Consumers to Avoid Phone Scams

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves' intent on stealing their money or their identity. The agency offers information and tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials.

Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling.

Scams cost victims over \$23 million. Nearly 4,550 victims have collectively paid over \$23 million as a result of these scam.

The IRS will not:

Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.

Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.

Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card. Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone. Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying.

If you don't owe taxes, or have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately. Call: 800-366-4484

<u>Ejercicios de Fuerza</u> trabajan musculos adultos y aumenta su metabolismo, que en cambio ayuda a mantener su peso y azucar en control.

<u>Ejercicios de Balance</u> ayudan a los musculos de las piernas y en esa forma evitar caidas, al mismo tiempo nos ayuda mantenernos independientes. Se reporta que hay mas de 300,000 casos de caderas rotas al añó, la mayor parte siendo envejecientes que se han caido.

<u>Ejercicios de Resistencia</u> son ejercicios de cualquier aactividad fisica como caminar, trotear, nadar, ciclismo, o cualquier acción que estimule el corazón y respiración por un tiempo extendido. La resistencia se aumenta gradualmente, empezando con cinco minutos de ejercicios.

El Rancho Starlight tiene un salon de ejercicios para los residentes en la segunda casa club.
