

has found diminished quality of life and an increased risk for death.

Humans are social animals and need the contact with others. As we age, our social network can decrease because of deaths, limited mobility, and economics. The friends we had when we were younger die or move. Our health limits our activities; we no longer drive or the body no longer moves easily. Our financial resources decline and we cannot afford to do what we once did. We are alone.

Although little can be done about some of the effects of aging, social isolation is mostly in our control. Our friends may not be around, but here, at Starlight Ranch we have a community bound together by age.

- Build friends.

As one study says, "Thus, despite inevitable physical deterioration, we may be able to enhance a satisfying late life by optimizing our social relationships (Quality of Life Research, Jan. 2016)."


Harvey Edgerton Viudo, padre de seis. Experiencia como oficial de agencia de inquilinos, NYC.
