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DAY TRIP: FLORIDA SOUTHERN COLLEGE

How about a day-trip to Lakeland to see the largest single-site collection of Frank Lloyd Wright architecture in the world? Only a 1.5 hour drive from the Ranch; Lakeland is approximately halfway between Orlando and Tampa on Interstate 4. Wright was an influential architect of the 20th century. Many are familiar with his famous house "Fallingwater" in Pennsylvania or the Guggenheim Museum in New York City.

The name for the collection at FSC is "Child of the Sun" which came from Wright's idea of replacing the 'uninspired' buildings with those that would "grow out of the ground and into the light, a child of the sun." Several tour types ranging from free, walking or a guided \$20 Basic, and others are available. Senior discounts too!

HOA BOARD ELECTIONS FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

Each November an election is held at the Annual Membership meeting to select members to sit on the Board of directors to lead, fight-for and help all the homeowners of Starlight Ranch. The board seats alternate with one and two-year terms. This year's Annual Membership meeting is on Saturday, November 19th at 10:00 AM in the front (ACH) clubhouse.

The Home Owners' Association (HOA) Board is a buffer between the residents and the park owner Equity Lifestyle Properties (ELS). The Board also helps in other ways with resident issues and complaints, and especially with negotiating with ELS on rent increases, maintenance and amenity issues.

During the third week of October, if you are a current, paid member of the HOA, you will receive by U.S. mail a packet containing: an annual letter and proposed 2017 budget, candidate ballot, proxy, a form for your 2017 membership and a ballot envelope.

Please plan to attend to cast your votes for who will be representing you in the future. If you are unable to make the meeting and election, please complete your ballot and proxy, seal it in the envelope and print your name and lot number on it. You may mail it in an additional envelope to the HOA address (2925 Wild Horse Road; Orlando, FL 32822) or drop it in the locked HOA box located on the wall next to the bulletin board in the front clubhouse. Please be sure to include the signed proxy in case an item for a vote comes up by the membership at the meeting.

When the home is owned by a husband and wife or significant other and both are members of the HOA, they must designate a voting member amongst them. Only one vote per household / lot may be cast.

TO YOUR HEALTH: HEARING

Hearing loss is one of the most common conditions of aging. Over 80% of those over age 70 report some loss. After the age of 18, our hearing begins to slowly decline. The decline

is further accelerated from a lifetime of loud noises: work, music / rock and roll, or ambient noises.

The decline is mostly in sensitivity to higher frequencies. The high notes of violins can be lost or unheard. The loss of higher frequencies can also complicate speech recognition. However, if the sound levels of the surrounding environment are subdued, conversations are easier to comprehend. Noisy restaurants can be more difficult. Loss is more pronounced in men than women, so your husband not answering may be more to a hearing issue than ignoring you!

Hearing loss can have serious consequences:

- Social isolation because you feel left out of the conversation.
- Misunderstanding of a conversation because not all the words are heard.
- Perception as being mentally deficient because you answer inappropriately or not at all.

The most common treatment for hearing loss is hearing aids. While effective, they do require daily care. This may require extra work, but the consequences of not or improper hearing are heavy. Therefore, hearing loss must be coped and dealt with. Several strategies make the decline in hearing more manageable:

- Tell your family and friends about your hearing loss.
- Ask people to face you when they talk so that you can see their faces. If you watch movement and expressions, it may help you to understand them better.
- Ask people to speak louder, but not shout.
 Tell them they do not have to talk slowly, just more clearly.
- Turn off the television or the radio when you are not actively listening to it.
- Be aware of noise around you that can make hearing more difficult. When you go to a restaurant, for example, do not sit near

the kitchen or near a band playing music. Background noise makes it hard to hear people talk.

Coping with the decline in hearing can be frustrating but it does not mean the end of meaningful social interactions. Request more information from your doctor or at: https://www.nidcd.nih.gov/health/age-related-hearing-loss.


