FROM THE BOARD: There are a lot of things going on in Starlight Ranch that everyone needs to know. To begin, Carmen Viera, the Board Secretary, is the person that has been designated by the Board to meet with park manager, David Stanz. After meeting with David, management has taken care of most of the items that were brought to his attention by the previous president.

The floor in the front clubhouse has been stripped and waxed. New vertical blinds were purchased for the front clubhouse dining area windows. The veteran's pictures have been put back up at the back clubhouse, with the exception of two items. Whoever is in charge of representing the Veteran's group, might consider further addressing the issue with David.

Management went over the process of eviction and how the law requires that certain steps be taken before residents can be evicted from their home and the park. It is not an easy process. Complaints were also discussed. Management requires that all complaints be signed by the resident(s) complaining before any action can be taken. Once filed management will then issue a letter of acknowledgement to the complainer and then will proceed to handle the issue. If the issue continues, additional complaints must be filed.

The mailbox bulletin boards have been repaired, the sink and dishwasher in the front clubhouse were repaired and replaced, and a thermometer was installed inside each clubhouse's oven to ensure that they are heating correctly. If you use the ovens, please monitor the temperature and report any inconsistencies. There are many more issues pending and many of them were discussed at the ELS Statutory Meeting on Monday, February 27, 2017. The details will be given at the March Board meeting and in the April newsletter.

Carmen will be available on Mondays and Thursdays in March from 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM at the HOA office in the back clubhouse to address any resident concerns, questions, or problems you may want to discuss with the HOA. Please stop by and visit your new HOA office. All members and non-members are welcome.

March will be another exciting month, with more activities and events added. We are working hard to bring you more activities & events. Give us feedback and help! Our ultimate goal is to keep you informed and work with management to address many of the issues that are plaguing our community.

Your HOA is here to protect your interest and investment in your property. If you have not become an HOA member now is the time to do so, forms and instructions are on the HOA bulletin board in the front clubhouse. TO YOUR HEALTH: ARTHRITIS

Mary, Mary, how does your garden grow? Not as well as when I was young for arthritis has taken its toll, I find it hard to get off the ground or work my little hoe.

Arthritis is the most common chronic illness in the United States with rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis, and gout the most common.

Rheumatoid arthritis (RA) is caused by autoimmunity reactions that make the joints to swell. Women are more than twice as likely to develop RA as men. And women tend to develop it early, between the ages of 30 and 60. The causes of RA are unknown. People who suffer from RA will have acute episodes called flares and then periods of remission. With RA, the hands almost always are affected although it can affect any other joints and internal organs as well. Joint deformities and accompanying pain can be very debilitating. Treatment is usually medications, exercise, rest and protecting the joints from further injury.

More common with people over the age of 60, osteoarthritis is a progressive form of arthritis where the cartilage breaks down and becomes stiffer. When the cartilage starts to deteriorate the bones start grinding together causing pain and stiffness when moving the joint. This is most noticeable in the fingers, which can become knobby. It also can appear in the knees, hips and spine. Bone spurs may grow at the edges of the joints, also causing pain. Osteoarthritis does not affect internal organs like rheumatoid arthritis, but it can cause severe deformities of the bones and limit mobility. No specific treatment can stop the progressive degeneration. Physical therapy or hot or cold compresses are commonly used along with braces or other supports. Replacement surgery is also common. The pain from osteoarthritis is usually treated with overthe-counter pain medications. Supplements like glucosamine and chondroitin are of uncertain value and can adversely affect other medications, and should be taken with approval of a physician. Since weight is a major contributor to osteoarthritis, moderate, low-impact exercise, like swimming, can reduce the pain and improve mobility.

A third kind of arthritis is gouty arthritis, which is caused by the deposit of uric acid crystals—shaped like thin needles—in the joints. It is more common in men over the age of 50 than in women. Risk factors include obesity, moderate to heavy alcohol consumption, and high blood pressure. Gout usually manifests itself in the joints of the hands or the feet with swelling of the affected joints. The attack can be sudden and very painful. Prevention is the best medication: drink lots of

fluids (cherry juice is recommended) and avoid shellfish and meats like liver.

Although we may not be able to prevent arthritis walking down the garden path, we should not let it isolate us from living. With arthritis the joints may not move as they did, some of the activities once enjoyed may become spectator events. However, the wide, bright world comes in the window each morning, and birds still sing, and flowers still smell sweet. Enjoy what you can do and don't dwell on what you can't.

We went to visit this quaint village to see where the two of them, as children, lived. When Peter was 12 years old he contracted Polio, the family relocated from Elkhorn, Wisconsin, so that the magic of swimming in the salt water could help his leg.

The village offers a view into Florida as it used to be. Prepare for your breath to be taken away as you walk the wide, beautiful beach – with the bluest-blue and greenest-green Gulf waters. Native Americans lived there before the arrival of the Spanish explorers in 1528. Legend has it that it was named from a French phrase, "Passe Aux Grilleurs" (the passage of the grillers), in honor of the fishermen who used the land as a campground. In 1989 it was recognized as a National Historic District.

Local artists sell hand-crafted goods every Saturday next to the Paradise Grille. Adirondack chairs are on the sand for you to use, and there is live music too. On Friday evening, we ate mouth-watering crab cakes on a wharf. Only about two hours from Orlando, it can be done in a day, but stay overnight and really enjoy your time there.



Crockpot Corned Beef and Cabbage

Prep time: 10 min. **Cook time:** 8 hours **Total time:** 8 hours 10 min. Serves: 8

INGREDIENTS:

- 5-6 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 small onion, cut into wedges
- 3 cups of water
- 2 TBSP sugar
- 2 TBSP vinegar
- 8 oz beer
- 4 lbs corned beef brisket
- 1 (1 lb) bag of baby carrots
- 1 lb small red potatoes, quartered
- 1 head of green cabbage, cut into wedges
- seasoning packet usually comes with beef

INSTRUCTIONS:

- First place onion wedges and garlic at the bottom of your crockpot. This is going to act as a stand for your meat, so it doesn't touch the bottom and dry out. Place beef on top of onions and garlic.
- 2. Next, mix together water, beer, sugar and vinegar.
- Pour over beef and then sprinkle seasoning packet over meat. If you are using my homemade corned beef seasoning packet, simply mix together the mustard seeds, bay leaves, allspice berries, salt and pepper and sprinkle on top of beef.
- 4. Set crockpot, cover and cook on LOW for 8 hours.
- 5. After 4 hours of cooking, add in potatoes and carrots.
- 6. Cover and continue cooking
- When 1 hour remains, add cabbage to the crockpot. Cover and continue cooking for the remainder of the time.

Extra corn beef and potatoes can be made into hash Extra cooked corn beef can be frozen for up to 3 months


