#### PINEAPPLE CHICKEN

1/4 cup Heinz 57 Sauce

- 1/2 cup of water
- 1 8-ounce can crushed pineapple in juice
- 3 tablespoons of brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts

In a small bowl: combine water, Heinz 57 sauce, pineapple with juice and brown sugar. Set aside.



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

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#### **GOLF CARTS**



Golf carts can cost thousands of dollars and a specialized policy can help protect your investment. When considering insurance for your golf cart, it's important that you look at the benefits of a policy that is specifically designed for golf carts rather than an endorsement on a homeowners policy. Make sure things like theft and liability are covered.

More coverage equals more value. Here is a summary of valuable standard and optional coverages:

- Collision coverage protects your golf cart in the event of damage caused by collisions with things like other vehicles, trees or utility poles, regardless of fault.
- Other Than Collision coverage provides coverage for other kinds of damage to the golf cart, such as fire, theft, flood or vandalism.
- Liability coverage for third-party injury and property damage claims resulting from an accident involving the covered golf cart.
- Medical Payments provides primary coverage for medical bills incurred for injuries resulting from a motor vehicle accident.
- Annual Policies mean year-round coverage with no lay-up period, whenever you want to take a spin in your golf cart, you're covered. No extra phone calls, no hassles!
- Optional coverage for Transport Trailers covers trailers used to transport the insured golf cart. This optional physical damage coverage
  is an excellent choice for trailers valued at up to \$7,500.

Your Farmers agent can offer you a policy that provides both property and liability coverage on your golf cart. Property coverage is insurance on the golf cart itself. Liability coverage protects you if there is a claim brought against you due to damage caused by the golf cart.

#### Why Property Damage Liability coverage is important

Say you're driving your golf cart through your park on the way to the golf course for a day of relaxation. Before you get there, however, you accidentally run into a parked car. There is damage to the golf cart, and the owner of the car submits a claim for the damage done to her passenger-side door.
