

DO YOU REMEMBER THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF STARLIGHT RANCH MOBILE HOME PARK?

At HOA meetings, we often learn that a lot of residents seem to have forgotten the list of rules that everyone receives when moving into Starlight Ranch. These include the rules for auto use on property, especially observance of speed limits and parking on streets, age of occupants and pets. Here I am addressing the most discussed complaints at HOA meetings.

The number 1 complaint is that many residents totally ignore the speed limit signs. This is a rule, so remember that continued speeding can result in eviction from the park, like any other rule violation that happens twice in a one (1) year period of time. There have been suggestions to get the Sheriff to enforce our speed limits. The HOA will continue to explore this possibility.

Pets are somewhat ignored by both residents and management. Two pets per home, each weighing less than 75 pounds at maturity is the standard, and everyone is supposed to register their pets. The most common complaint is the barking and this is something that should be addressed by the owner.

Section 1 of the rules outline that a report of the names and ages of <u>all</u> occupants of every unit be reported to Management on January 1st of every even number year. This info is used to determine if 80% or more of the units are occupied by at least one person who is 55 or older, insuring that we remain a Senior community. If enforced, this rule would help management with the unauthorized occupant problem for both adults and children. Since this rule also forbids occupancy of persons under 40 years of age, enforcement of this rule would help with dealing with the other of the top 2 complaints at HOA meetings, specifically children.

Everyone at Starlight Ranch has contractually agreed not to allow those under 40 to live here. On school days, a School Bus stops at the front of our park and drops off a child. The child is driven by an adult to a home in Starlight Ranch. Also, several have observed children of elementary school age walking or riding bikes toward the park exit in the morning, and into the park in the afternoon. I doubt that all these students are going to their grandparents house, as their parents would have to live close enough to Starlight Ranch for the student to be assigned to a school close to Starlight. Another possibility is that their parents are also living here with the child.

The only way that the park is going to be able to take action against these rule breakers is if residents are willing to step forward and report violations of Starlight Ranch park rules. They must also be willing to testify to their observations if needed in order to evict those who continue to ignore the contract signed before move-in that no one under 40 is to live here in the park.

People come to the Town Hall and other meetings and expect the HOA to take care of the problems. We can help you report this to the office, but do remember that if you expect the office to take action, there exists a possibility that we might have to testify to the presence of the children and young adults that were observed.
