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Hello Starlight Ranch residents:

I would like to start out by saying that it has been a very busy month for the HOA board as well as yours truly. We are glad to say that there has been some GREAT response from park management on several issues that we have been working to resolve.

One of our problems was the long term parking in the clubhouse parking lots. As you may have noticed there was a flyer with your monthly statement explaining the changes. Although we do see that this may be a bit inconvenient from time to time, some residents have been using the parking lots as vehicle storage lots, which make it difficult for other residents to find a parking space when they go to their mail boxes, use the clubhouse pool or attend other clubhouse events. This is why the board and management, working together, devised the new plan.

Parking has been only one of many issues we are working on or have already solved. I mention this one, because it has come to my attention that some residents are in the dark when it comes to what our HOA has been doing. If you are not active in the community or attend our events you could easily think that "the HOA does not get anything done". Joining (only \$10 for a whole year!) and attending the board meetings and Town Hall Meetings (each only once a month!) will enlighten you.

Not only do I sit as the President of our Home Owners Association here at Starlight Ranch; but in order to gain knowledge about all of the rules and regulations, I also have a seat on the Select Committee with Networking for Progress on the state level. This is a group that represents the HOA's all over the state.

In Equity Life Style parks (ours), this group meets 4 times a year with top ELS management for the state of Florida. We also have a monthly meeting to work on common issues and receiving that information is the key to having a good working relationship with management for all of us. This is "my key" to knowing the rules and regulations that not only WE have to obey but THE MANAGEMENT has to use in making decisions running the park. All of the ELS parkmanagers get minutes from these meetings and any agreements that are approved at these quarterly meetings are added to all of the manager's playbooks.

This is just a tip of the iceberg of things going on with your HOA. You can see that it is very important to have a strong HOA when dealing with management. The state rules do say that all residents that are homeowners are members of the HOA. If you are not a paid member (only \$10 for a whole year!) you are still a member, but you have NO SAY on board decisions that really do make a difference in our community. Without a good strong HOA, unfortunately, the management will make all of the calls on how the park is run ignoring either intentionally or neglectfully the rules and regulations the state has set up to make it fair for both residents and management.

I hope this has helped clear up some confusion about what the board does. Don't forget we also have some great activities! Give us a chance! You might really enjoy the event and it will give you a chance to meet other residents. We have some really great and friendly residents!!


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Resident of the Month By Joan Stearns

Max at 18 years old

Interviewing the residents of Starlight Ranch is one of the best things I've ever taken on. It is amazing to me that in our neighborhood we have such remarkable people with such vast backgrounds.

Max Gonzalez, who is 90 years old, and lives by himself – and his sweet dog, Tiye – has wonderful neighbors who help care for him. He has lived in the Orlando area for over 10 years. He was born in Puerto Rico, then moved to Tampa (which he considers his hometown), then moved to Spain from the ages of two through seven. He then returned to the United States, and went to High School in Tampa. He has lived in Europe, Canada, and South America. His father was in the tobacco industry, enabling Max to live in a great amount of luxury. He has four sisters, all born in Spain. Max never married, and has no children.

He was a classical dancer, trained by George Balanchine of the American Ballet, on Madison & Fifth in Manhattan, for 12 years. He danced with the NY City Ballet. He loves all the traditional ballets, including Swan Lake, Sleeping Beauty, and Giselle. During his ballet career, Max also a professor of Comparative Literature in Puerto Rico.

What a life he has had! He happened to be in Barcelona during WWII, which he still considers a wonderful, beautiful city. Hitler's troops used to take their small vacations in Barcelona...Max befriended one of his soldiers, and spent a year with him and his family after the war. He also was in Cuba just before Castro took over...as a matter of fact; he took the last boat out of Cuba to Key West.

Max is almost blind, but you can see him on his scooter. He takes walks by himself, shops by himself, and is ever thankful for all his friends who come bearing food.
