
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#### Oct Activities



Hey Starlight Ranch residents! Here is a friendly reminder about one of the rules listed in your Starlight Ranch owner contract. Some folks may think that as they have bought their home and pay the required rent for the land that it sets on; they can do as they please to their home and yard. Sorry, but that's not what we signed up for. As a resident you are required to follow the rules and guidelines in your contract. Example: not painting your house a different color. To do so you are required to get Starlight Ranch management approval for your selected color. This is required to keep a standard to the homes in our community. A big plus is that keeping a high standard enhances your selling price should you decide to sell and leave the Ranch. If you are breaking the rules you agreed to when buying your home, you may have your home taken away through the legal system. You will be losing any investment you currently have in your home. Bottom line: If you don't like the rules, and don't want to follow them, perhaps it is time to consider selling your home and moving somewhere with less rule constrains!!
