Cranberry Sauce


Ingredients



I am so lucky to have found a seasonal job with Honey Baked Ham Co. – it's one of the best jobs I've ever had! I am one of 40 seasonal hires, and we have bonded as if we've always worked together. We talk to each other, not about each other. We're all treated with respect by the management, and we're all told often how we are making a difference! One of the best things about working there is that they offer flexible hours!

Every day I walk in the store and immediately smell the delicately sweet crunchy glaze...it's a great balance of savory and sweet. Dinner has never been easier...just unwrap, serve, and take in the praise.

This year Honey Baked is offering new side dishes - One of them is Tuscan-style broccoli (broccoli tossed with lemon, garlic, olive oil, and parmesan cheese) – unbelievably delicious. Another is baked cinnamon apples (Granny Smith apple slices baked in a sweet cinnamon and sugar sauce).

Cranberries for Christmas?

...some words from John Moss, a cranberry grower in Cranmoor, WI

Harvest season is from mid-September to the end of October. When the berries are ripe, we flood the beds, or what some people call bogs, so the berries come off the vines easier. Cranberries float, so when we add more water, they rise to the top so we can collect them without damaging them. After the berries are transported to the Ocean Spray plant, we need to remove the water in the beds quickly so it doesn't damage the vines. To do that, we remove boards from the floodgates or occasionally pump the water out.

In the winter, we flood the fields again with water when it's cold enough to freeze. The ice acts as an insulating layer to protect the tiny buds from the colder temperatures above. Around February, we place sand on the ice, and when the ice melts, the sand falls and stimulates new vine growth.

The buds bloom in June, and we bring in honeybees to pollinate the flowers. We fertilize the vines, monitor for plant stress, and monitor soil tension probes to see what's happening under the plants. We also water very carefully. Cranberries are very picky...you need just the right amount of water.
