Its' best feature is Dean Martin or Frank Sinatra singing in the background.

Whenever we go there during the week, we order their special...two slices of pizza and a drink for \$4.00...huge slices!

Try their soups...Pasta e Fagioli to Italian Wedding Soup...their salads includes antipasto...or try their gourmet pizzas (Hawaiian or BBQ Chicken). Think about their pastas (with great meatballs or sausage)...and desserts (NY Cheesecake, Chocolate Cake, and Cannoli)!

Their food is definitely what keeps me going back (and, of course, the background music).

Here is the recipe for Joan Laverty's Out-Of-This-World Cream Puffs:

- 4 Eggs
- 1 cup Water
- 1 cup Flour
- 1 Stick of Margarine Dash of Salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Boil the water, margarine & salt. Remove from heat and add flour. Mix thoroughly. Let cool 10 minutes. Add whole eggs one at a time. Mix well.

Spray cookie sheet and drop by tablespoons. Bake 25-30 minutes. Cut in half and fill with vanilla pudding. Top with dark chocolate frosting.

#### It happened in May

**May 1st** - Observed as May Day, a holiday and spring festival since ancient times, also observed in socialist countries as a workers' holiday or Labor Day.

May 5th - Celebrated in Mexico as Cinco de Mayo, a national holiday in remembrance of the Battle of Puebla in 1862, in which Mexican troops under General Ignacio Zaragoza, outnumbered three to one, defeated the invading French forces of Napoleon III.

May 5, 1865 - Decoration Day was first observed in the U.S., with the tradition of decorating soldiers' graves from the Civil War with flowers. The observance date was later moved to May 30th and included American graves from World War I and World War II, and became better known as Memorial Day. In 1971, Congress moved Memorial Day to the last Monday in May, thus creating a three-day holiday weekend.

May 27<sup>th</sup>-Birthday - Legendary Wild West figure Wild Bill Hickok (1837-1876) was born in Troy Grove, Illinois. He was a frontiersman, lawman, legendary marksman, army scout and gambler. On August 2, 1876, he was shot dead during a poker game by a drunk in the Number Ten saloon in Deadwood, in the Dakota Territory. In his hand he held a pair of eights and a pair of aces which became known as the 'dead man's hand.'
