And look around your yard to make sure that loose items are put in a safe place. Please, safety first for your home and your neighbors. I was in a meeting with ELS upper management and asked them if they could provide residents with local contact information on storm shelters and other issues that we may need in case of a severe storm, they may already have this available but I will be checking to see. And if not, we will see if something can be worked out to have that information available here at the community for you. As a friendly reminder the No parking on the streets will be start being enforced in October. I still see a lot of people parking on the street and enforcement means your car will be TOWED AT YOUR EXPENCE. If you have a caregiver or someone coming to help you and no room in your driveway, they can stop at the office and get a vendor parking tag so they are not towed. There is also a change to the overflow parking across the street from back clubhouse, any vehicles there for more than 48 hours will be TOWED, the 48 hours is so that if you have guest on the weekend when office is closed they can park there without being towed. It would be best if you know you are having company or guest to go to office and get a parking permit so they can park in the common areas legally without worry of being towed. These changes are going to be a bit inconvenient for some but due to so many people leaving vehicles on street all of the time it had become a big safety issue with other vehicles being able to go through the community safely, the parking in overflow is due to people using area as a storage lot instead of a short term parking area. As always I want to thank all of you that help out

the community when you volunteer for our activities and other HOA business and we would like to let all of our residents know that we would love to see you at our activities and you may meet a new friend or enjoy a great meal. Most everyone who knows me, knows that I Love to Cook! And unfortunately eat it as well. Here are some ideas and Recipes I use.

Do you like Seven Seas Italian Dressing you make yourself with the little bottle? Instead of using regular vinegar, use Balsamic vinegar.

Like steak? Roasts? Use your crock pot instead of the oven or broiler. Use a cheaper steak, add beef stock, cook for @ 4 hours. Use the drippings to make gravy, serve over egg noodles. Keeps the house cooler than using the oven.

Do you like Fajitas, burritos, tacos? Use Chipotle Salsa on any type meat in you crock pot. Cook for 4 hours. Just add the fixings.

Take Tri-Color Rotini pasta, after cooking according to directions; add olive oil, parmesan cheese, ½ tbl spoon butter, California blend garlic salt. Its a great side dish. To change it up, add sliced green and black olives, or any type bell pepper. Have leftovers from this? Add any canned chicken, or tuna, and it makes another meal. You can do this with Rice-a-Roni also.

How about chili? I won the chili contest at Starlight Ranch a couple years ago with this. It's my quick and easy recipe. Brown 1 or 2 pounds of ground beef, add the following: 2 tbl spoons of chili powder, 1 tbl spoon of flour, 1 tsp of cumin, 1 tsp of smoky paprika 1 tsp of sugar white or brown your preference, Mix with browned meat, add large 32 oz can id diced tomatoes, 1 can of red kidney beans. Cover and simmer on low for 15 minutes.

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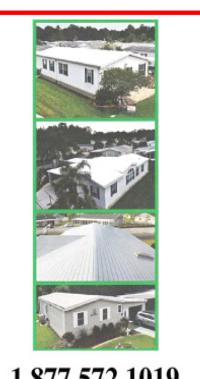
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Things to Remember
