There are some changes that we will have to get use to and a couple of things to do getting ready for the change. **You will need to check your vehicle status registered with the office records to make sure that it is current so your new card to get through the gate will be registered to the proper vehicle.** Also we are still working on getting information out on how to get nonresidents and guest into the community. In the long run this will help to make our community a safer place to live and help out with cleaning up the mess with all of the unauthorized residents.

If you live at Starlight Ranch you are required to be a registered and approved in the management office. The gate is going to help get this problem a bit more under control by not letting people into the community that are not registered residents and those that are coming in will be the responsibility of the home owner that let them in.

We know it's not going to fix all of the problems but when the residents are aware that they are responsible for people they bring in that violate the rules there should be less problem with people here breaking the rules.

As I have told you many times before, it's not all about the gate going up and down as much as it is having security cameras and a sign that defines us as a gated

community. Proper signage makes a difference in how Law enforcement can handle unauthorized people in the community and changes the rules about people going through that are not supposed to be here.

We will be sharing more information as it becomes available. If you have questions or concerns about these changes, please contact one of the board members or come to a meeting and we will work to get you an answer or pass on your concerns to the proper authorities.

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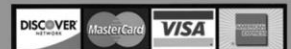

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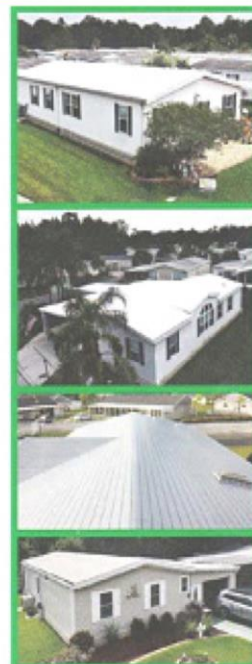


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VEHICLE RULES
