### **GRATINEE OF CAULIFLOWER**

This dish serves 6-8 people

6 TBS (3/4) stick unsalted butter

4 Cloves, garlic, minced

4 oz. thinly sliced Prosciutto cut into strips

Florets of 1 large head of cauliflower cut into ¼" lengthwise slices

2 TBS unbleached all-purpose flour

Pinch of cayenne pepper

Salt and freshly ground Black Pepper to taste

1-1/2 cups grated Swiss Cheese

Preheat oven to 350 deg.

Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat

Add the garlic and sauté about 2 minutes

Stir in the Prosciutto and sauté 2 minutes more

Pour the cauliflower into a shallow au gratin dish

Bake until top is lightly brown and bubbly – about 30 min.



#### THOUGHTS ON RECYCLING


I walk on the sidewalk along Wild Horse in the mornings. On Wednesday....I am proud to live in a community that is so diligent about putting out our recycling bins. I do notice, however, some things that we could do better (ME INCLUDED). I have researched several resources online on "how to do it"... and have learned a few things.

- Pasteboard is the "stuff" that cereal boxes are made out of. One of the things we can do to help the people at the recycling center is break down our cardboard boxes. Undo the glue on the bottom as well as the top and flatten them. They stack better in the bin and make it faster to recycle at the end of their journey. This also includes cake mix boxes and other boxes that contain food, but the food is safely contained in the plastic/wax bag inside and never touches the pasteboard.
- Cardboard is what we make large packing boxes from. You will know these because they are "corrugated". They have the "wiggly stuff" between the layers of brown paper. These should also be broken down and will fit very nicely in you bin if you do this.
- Pizza boxes after being used for yummy pizza are a "NO"... grease and cheese are soaked into the bottom of the box and cannot be recycled. Make you want to lick the bottom of the box.
- For some unknown reason most bottle lids are not recyclable. I have never found a reason listed. Some are stamped with a number (usually 5). These are good. The others are not. Save a minute or two at the journeys end by taking the ones that are not recyclable the bottle before you put it in your bin. This includes most water bottles.
- Guess what? They really don't care if you soak the labels off of your glass recyclables. They are going to soak them to sanitize them at their end whether you do or not. Save yourself a few minutes, and precious water, and just wash the jar/bottle out. So don't bother with the label.

Watch for more tips as I find them.
