#### **NOT TRASHY!!!**

There has been much confusion on what the weekly trash schedule is. That being said, here is the updated schedule so everyone knows and abides by it.

**TUESDAY- Trash is collected for household waste only.** That means NO yard waste or furniture or appliances.

WEDNESDAY- Recycling products only. You cannot use a plastic bag to have them collect it. It MUST be in a recycling bin or they will not pick it up. If you need a recycling bin, you can call **407-273-3130**.

FRIDAY- Yard waste is collected. It is limited to 3 cubic yards per week. The tree and shrub clippings must be in a trash can or securely tied with string or twine. Small furniture and other bulk items may also be picked up as well as household trash. YOU ARE ONLY ALLOWED 2 BULK ITEMS ON FRIDAYS. DON'T PUT OUT MORE THAN THAT!

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND, ANY HEAVY FURNITURE ITEMS OVER SIX FEET AND ANY AND ALL ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES MUST BE CALLED INTO WASTE PRO AT 407-774-0800.

THERE WILL BE AN ADDITIONAL CHARGE FOR THIS TYPE OF PICK UP OR YOU CAN TAKE IT TO THE COUNTY LANDFILL YOURSELF.

BE CONSIDERATE OF YOUR NEIGHBORS AND THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE AND FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES SO UNSIGHTLY ITEMS DON'T LINGER ON THE STARLIGHT PROPERTY.

#### THE NOSEY DETECTIVE......

This month, all I could think about is that we live in a 55+ community and our health should be our number one priority. So, what do we do if we have medical emergencies???

The most important thing is to remember dire situations call for you to dial **911** and let the ambulance with trained personnel handle it. We all know that every minute counts when your life is at risk. However, do you know what the best scenario is for all kinds of situations and how to handle them?

For example, do you know where the nearest hospital is?

**AdventHealth Hospital-** 7727 Lake Underhill Road- Open 24 hours a day. This hospital takes an average of 11 minutes to drive to if you were to go by car to the emergency room.

In some situations, depending on the time of day, a walk-in clinic might be a better choice. For example...

**59 Walk in clinic-** 3900 South Goldenrod is open M-F- 8 am until 5 pm, Saturdays from 9am until 2 pm- The drive is around 5 minutes.

**Urgent Care Family Clinic-** 1130 S. Semoran is open M-F from 9 am to 5 pm-This drive is around 7 minutes.

**AdventHealth Centra Care Conway-** 5810 S. Semoran M-F from 9 am to 5 pm-This drive is around 5 minutes.

So do yourself a favor and take a drive in advance using your GPS and find out where these locations are so you feel confident when driving there for an emergency situation. It is also a good idea to stop into the walk in clinics and get familiar with what kind of emergencies they can handle so you don't waste time being told to go to the hospital emergency room. While there, inquire about what insurances they accept for your benefit. This way, you can make informed decisions ahead of time.

Most of us panic in these types of situations, so if you get yourself acquainted in advance as to how you want to handle health emergencies, you can have a better chance of thriving in a medical conundrum instead of just surviving both health wise and money wise.

Every second counts in a medical emergency. Get informed now before it is too late. Great health and happiness to all Starlight Ranch residents.

#### **CORNED BEEF AND CABBAGE**

**Ingredients-** 3 lbs of corned beef brisket, 10 small red potatoes, 5 carrots-peeled and cut into 3 inch slices, salt/pepper, 3 tbl spoons of beef bouillon and 1 large head of cabbage cut into small wedges.

**Step 1-** Place corned beef into a pot covered in water, add beef bouillon, salt and pepper to taste and boil- once at a full boil, reduce heat to simmer 50 minutes per pound or until tender.

**Step 2**- Add carrots and potatoes to the pot and remain simmering until the vegetables are softened and then add the cabbage for 15 more minutes. Remove the meat and let it rest for 15 minutes.

**Step 3-** Slice meat across the grain and add
