MOTORCYCLE MANIA, MAD DOGS AND OTHER MAYHEMS!

That headline sums up the current status of Starlight ranch. I would like to thank the board members who served this past year and are stepping down for various reasons. It's a thankless job. Also, to Phil, who is not going to be editor of the newsletter. He has done a terrific job. I hope he reconsiders. We have had our differences about my negativity, I am only speaking the truth. The things I write about are the complaints from the worried and concerned residents of our community, and also from my observations, as I walk the streets every day. When I talk to people when I'm out and about, I mention where I live, I get positive feed back about our little community, and how nice it appears on the surface. A woman at Publix did call us double wide people. I told her I live among the nicest people anywhere.

The last month has not been good, a house being robbed, and police raiding a house on the corner of Wild Horse and Stallion for domestic disturbance, Illegals, drugs, we will never know. That same house has had as many as 4 motorcycles crammed in the lanai. Those motorcycles and others speed up and down Wild Horse Rd. at all hours of the day and night, also speeding cars pass you for driving the speed limit. Residents have also complained to me about trying to back out of driveways and cars driving on their grass to park on aprons. The gate is still a problem, easy fix, we need a guard 24/7 to control who gets in our community. He could also open the gate to let repair men in and most important, emergency Vehicles. I haven't seen a tow truck in here lately, vehicles are illegally parked everywhere.

I was recently informed about 2 pit bulls on the premises illegally and attacking people walking their dogs on Hitching Post and lower Wild Horse, where a dog died. I talked to the couple, they are devastated. It's very sad. The feral cats are increasing again too. I also have been told about a mini ant problem. I have them too. Ant baits are working they invited all their friends over for dinner. I hope everyone had a nice Thanksgiving, If everybody wants this to be the best place to live for all, we have to work together. Get involved, join the HOA, especially my Hispanic friends and neighbors. \$10.00 a year is a bargain, HOA fees in other communities are in the thousands. Till next time.
