THIS LAND IS YOUR LAND:NO IT'S NOT!

Hello everyone, I would like to start off with a statement. "I have not lost faith in my fellow man."No, I'm not talking about the current status of our divided country. That's as they say, out of my pay grade. It's about what happened to me in my own backyard, at Starlight Ranch. Residents complain about their neighbors about one thing or another all the time. I try to talk to everybody I come in contact with in my daily life, always have, always will. I am a friendly guy. I try to get along with everybody. But don't disrespect me or my family, try to screw me over and accuse me of something I didn't do. Then it is no longer Mr. Nice Guy. My wife and I went back to New York in April to get our house ready to sell. After that was done we came back to Orlando in September. I noticed the neighbors in the back had put up a chain link fence, the only problem was, it left a 2 foot by 30 foot strip of land there. I called it no man's land, because no man was cutting, watering, or maintaining the area. I called the office a few times, and they said they would tell the crew to cut and trim the area, but to no avail. So I trimmed it by hand. A few times, residents behind never said or did anything to it. I decided the best way to fix the problem was to put a weed barrier down and mulch the area at my expense. It looked really nice. I got no response from the residents. A few weeks later I put banana and fruit trees in, set up a soaker hose to water twice a week to establish roots. Still not a word from the residents, who put the fence up. While in New York for the holidays the tops of the fruit trees, mysteriously, were broken off. Then in January I got a letter informing me I have to remove all plants and trees. I brought it up to the office and found out they complained that my watering, leaves and roots were damaging their chain link fence. I tried not to laugh. Assistant manager Karen came down to work out the problem. First they accused me of killing their papaya trees and that 60 square feet of land that they lost would hurt the value of their house if they sold it. I lost my cool and told them they were crazy. This land is not theirs. They rent it. They live in Puerto Rico for most of the year, and left on January 18th, so why was this all necessary? By the way, my friend and neighbor next to them, who is hispanic, did not have to move or cut back his plants that were touching their precious fence. I really don't want to go there, is this a racial issue? Not on my part. In conclusion, if I am forced to remove plants and trees that are slightly over a lot line, does that mean every resident in Starlight has to remove them too? There are trees, shrubs, fences etc. that fit that criteria, including illegal stockade fencing. Just because you fence in your lot, it doesn't make it private property! So if residents have unregistered cars. Trailers, motorcycles and boats on or around their property, management can remove these vehicles at their own descretion. Until next time.




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
